Having looked at the cardinal or natural virtues, we now turn to the theological virtues of faith, hope and love. They are called theological virtues because they are supernatural – they are not part of our nature as human beings. We receive them as gifts from God. They perfect and complete the cardinal (natural) virtues. While the cardinal virtues are important for being a just, well-focused, disciplined and effective person, they, by themselves, do not bring us to the heart of goodness, our life in God and our part in the struggle of good vs. evil. We need the theological virtues to complement the natural ones.

FAITH: Faith is necessary for reaching our transcendental nature, for knowing the heart and will of God, for knowing the highest good and for calling upon the inspiration and grace of God. It helps us resist evil, conform our will to God's and to find and stay on the path to eternal life.

HOPE: While faith is necessary to achieve the good and gain eternal life, it is not enough – we also need hope and love. Hope is the desire for, and expectation of, eternal salvation through Jesus. Hope orients our will and life's purpose toward God. Without it we would be subject to despair and perhaps live for something other than God and eternal life.

LOVE: Again, while the cardinal virtues plus faith and hope are essential, even all together they are not enough. We require the supreme supernatural virtue of love to animate and guide the other six virtues to their ultimate goal – the heart of God. Love brings all the virtues to their highest end. As an example, let's look at how love affects justice and raises it up. The cardinal virtue of justice gives us the 'Silver Rule' – do not do unto others what you would not have them do unto you. We see this expressed in various ways in a couple of places in the Old Testament. Modern thinking might express it as such: do no unnecessary harm to others and if harm is unavoidable, minimize it. Now let's add love to justice. Love goes beyond the dictates of justice, opening itself to the good of others irrespective of what is due them in justice. Jesus taught the supremacy of love by His word and example. He took the 'nots' from the Silver Rule to give us the Golden Rule: do unto others as you would have them do unto you. Love elevates justice from just avoiding harm to doing good beyond just no harm. Justice tells us what we should not do to our neighbor but adding love tells us what we should do for others.

All seven virtues interact and are dependent on each other and even though the theological virtues bring the natural virtues to their highest level, the theological virtues need the cardinal virtues as their foundation. Faith without the cardinal virtues is likely to be ineffective and weak. Hope without the cardinal virtues is likely to be directionless. And though love is the supreme virtue that unites us with Jesus, it is almost powerless without the fortitude to live it, the courage to stand up for it, the prudence to guide it, the temperance to control what undermines it and the justice to prevent our using unjust means to noble ends. God is love and God encapsulates all of these virtues. Those who practice them are brought to perfection in Him. Practicing these virtues is how we combat the deadly sins.


Restore: Each week, Sr. Miriam will lead


