## *Interpreting Scripture*

There is a principle that Scripture scholars have come up with for interpreting the New Testament, and indeed all of Scripture, and it is called ‘asymmetrical hermeneutics’. For those of us who are not Scripture scholars and don’t know what that is, it basically means ‘one-directional interpretation’. This principle recognizes the development of revelation and doctrine through time from the time of Abraham to the time of Moses, to the time of the Judges, to the kingdom of David, to the major prophets and finally to the fullness of revelation in Jesus. The principle states that we can look backward from the fullness of the New Testament revelation in Jesus to the incomplete revelation of the Old Testament. But not the other way. There is no problem with seeing the Old Testament through the lens of the much fuller framework of the New Testament and that’s how we should see it. The New Testament teachings can tell us how to interpret Old Testament passages that seem to be at odds with Jesus’ teaching. We can’t do the opposite. We can’t interpret the fullness of revelation in the New Testament through the lens of the much narrower framework and teachings of the Old Testament. A lot of people use some Old Testament passages to justify some rather unloving actions and they think it must be okay because it is in the Bible. Their one-directional interpretation is going the wrong way. The Old Testament was formulated and written down during the time when Israel and their neighbors were a warring society (seems like nothing has changed) and there are many passages that are violent and at odds with Jesus’ teaching. The Old Testament was formulated and written within a culture that did not know the fullness of revelation through Jesus or the unconditional love of the Father or Jesus’ unconditional self-sacrificial love for the world. When interpreting Scripture we must give priority to Jesus’ commandments and teachings and look at those difficult passages through that lens. Perhaps we need to look at these passages of violence and hatred in a spiritual sense rather than a literal sense. We can equate those battles or wars to the spiritual battles against the moral vices and evils of the world that we must all face. This allows us to interpret those passages through the lens of Jesus and His teaching rather than whatever strikes our fancy.


