Jonah and the Big Fish - Part 2



We left off with Part 1 leading us to the two-fold role the whale plays in the parable of Jonah. The first is that the whale becomes the instrument leading to Jonah's repentance. Just admitting your guilt doesn't necessarily mean you are sorry for your actions. Admission is the first step but it must be followed by repentance. The other role the whale played was that it took Jonah to the place where God wanted him to be. He couldn't hide from God and God brought him back to his task. Like Jonah, God asks us to do some mission or task in our lives. If we try to run away from God, we must realize that He will continue to reach out to us. Like the whale, God will use some thing, some situation, some person, some vehicle, some words spoken by someone, to bring us back to where He needs us to be, back to our task/mission.

Throughout the parable, Jonah appears to be an angry man. He is angry at God for sending him to Nineveh. He is angry at God for being compassionate, or merciful, to the people of Nineveh. He is angry at God when the bush that had given his shade, withered and died. In the face of God's infinite compassion, Jonah has none. God speaks to us not only through His word, but also through our own sometimes confused emotions. It is often in the midst of our emotional lives that God speaks to us. Jonah's disobedience, anger and despair are symptoms of the fact that Jonah is a religious bigot. To him only the Hebrew people were worth saving and the pagans, no matter how good they were, were not worthy of God's mercy, compassion and forgiveness. There is still a lot of that floating around in today's world. Perhaps one of the reasons Jonah ran away in the first place was because he was afraid God would indeed be compassionate to the Ninevites and not destroy them. God was and He didn't and Jonah was angry for that. One of the points of this parable is that God is the God of all people and a God of compassion. Like Jonah, we may forget this and maybe resent God's mercy for some people we consider to be great sinners. Perhaps Jonah also felt that if God didn't destroy the Ninevites, then his own faithfulness to God was for nothing. The same can be said of the older brother in the parable of the prodigal son. If the younger son was not punished and cast out, then his faithfulness to his father would have been in vain. That of course is not the case. We are not to be angry at God's compassion for repentant sinners (we are sinners too) but we should embrace and extend His mercy to those repentant people also.

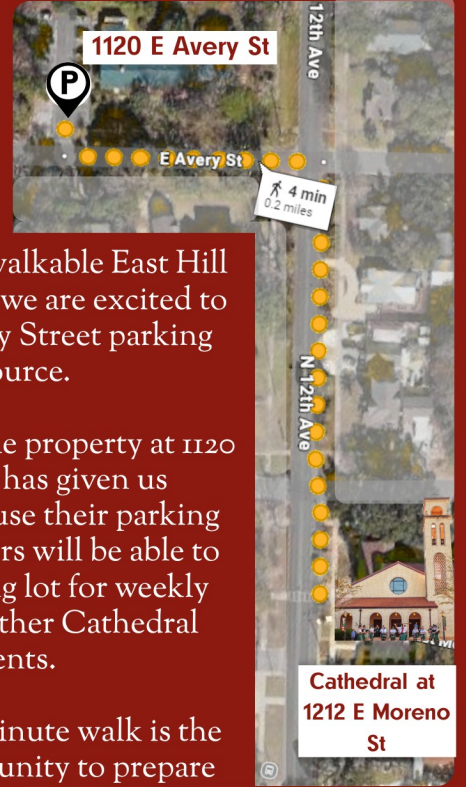
The book of Jonah has been called a parable of mercy. The religious prejudice of narrow-minded people like Jonah is directly challenged. The book of Jonah, like the parable of the prodigal son, ends without saying whether Jonah or the elder brother, embraced compassion for repentant sinners. Some people like to think they would have. The point of these parables being open ended is that we need to put ourselves in their place and think about what we would do.

Embrace and extend God's compassion and mercy or remain hard-hearted and descend into our self-made 'storms' and misery.

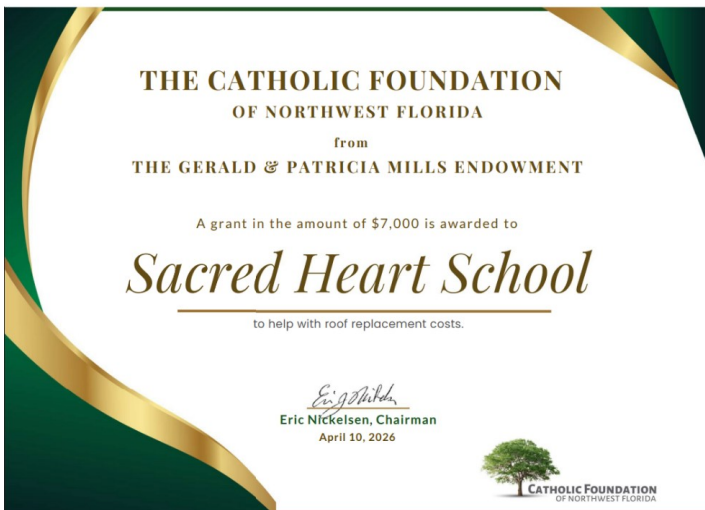
This quick 4 minute walk is the perfect opportunity to prepare yourself for the sacrament of the Eucharist before Mass.
