On Dec. 12, 1531, the image of Our Lady of Guadalupe appeared on the tilma of Juan Diego as he was showing the roses he had gathered to the bishop. A tilma is a loose sleeveless cloak also known as a mantle. There has always been skeptics, and probably always will be, about whether the image was painted or is of a miraculous origin. During the last hundred years or so there has been extensive testing by different experts of the image and there has been a number of startling results. The first is the tilma itself. It is hand woven from the coarse fibers of the agave cactus. Normally, a garment made of this material would last only 20 to 30 years before it rotted and fell apart. This tilma has maintained its biochemical and structural integrity for about 500 years so far. For the first 115 years it was displayed without and protection from the elements and was subjected to soot, candlewax, incense and touching which would have added to its deterioration. There is no scientific explanation for its longevity. Another enigma concerns the image's pigment. The pigments used for the image are from no known natural source – not animal, mineral or vegetable. Given that in 1531 there were no synthetic pigments, this is inexplicable. Experts have concluded that the cloth (tilma) was not prepared for painting in any way. There is no evidence of any brushstrokes. They could not explain how the image was made. It seems to have appeared in a single step without any preparation. Furthermore, in the nearly 500 years since its appearance, the image has suffered no cracking, no flaking and no degradation of color. Any painting of that age would have cracked and darkened but Our Lady of Guadalupe shows no signs of aging. The image also makes artistic use of the coarse fibers of the agave fabric to accentuate and give the impression of depth of certain features of the image, especially the eyes. The eyes of the image are perhaps the most intriguing of all. Numerous ophthalmologists have done studies on the eyes. The eyes have the proper curvature of the cornea even though the tilma is basically flat. They also show the triple reflection of objects seen by the eye. Whenever the human eye views an object, that object is reflected in each eye in three different places, two of which are right side up and one is upside down. This is due to the curvature of the cornea. The images reflected in the Madonna's eyes have the depth of field corresponding to a real human eye. When subjected to the light from an ophthalmoscope the eyes react as if they were a living eye. So what do her eyes reflect? One doctor enlarged the area of the corneas 2500 times and identified 13 figures – 7 in the central pupil under the cornea and 6 in the iris area under the cornea. Both the right and left eyes are consistent and precise in reflecting the scene being observed. The scene reflected in the eyes is that of Juan Diego opening his tilma in front of Bishop Juan de Fumarragon and other witness. The bishop is identified from other paintings of him from that era. The scene in the eyes was not observed from the vantage point of the tilma but from behind and above (at least 2 feet above) the gathering. There is no way someone in that day and time could have manufactured or painted that scene with the triple reflection in the eyes of the image. One other enigmatic aspect of the image is the stars on the mantle. Some believe them to be added later because there is paint on the stars. They were touched up probably to make them more golden. Some experts feel they are most likely part of the original image because of the pattern. In collaboration with some astronomers, it was determined that the stars correspond to the constellations present over Mexico City on December 12, 1531. But the perspective is not from viewing them from the earth looking up at the stars, but from beyond the stars looking at the earth. This requires a shift in the reference frame by rotating the cardinal axis 90 degrees counterclockwise. No 16th century Native or European would have such knowledge as that shifting perspective was discovered only in the 20th century.
