In the first part we looked at an overview of the beatitudes and the first three of the virtue beatitudes in more depth. Here we will review the last three of the virtue beatitudes.

The fifth beatitude is: 'Blessed are the merciful, for they shall obtain mercy'. For Jesus, and therefore it should be to us, mercy has two important aspects – forgiveness and compassion for those in need. Forgiveness is the key to the practice of agape love. Without forgiveness the cycle of resentment leading to vengeance leading to more harm and vengeance can't be broken. St Paul wrote: Beloved, never avenge yourselves but leave it to the wrath of God for it is written, Vengeance is mine, I will repay, says the Lord (Rom 12:19). Wrath does not mean anger in an emotional sense but rather it is a technical term in ancient Judaism to refer to 'a persons just desserts' where God's judgment determines what those just desserts are. So St Paul is not telling us to call God's anger upon those who may have offended us, or to make ourselves a self-appointed instrument of His vengeance, but rather to leave it to God's just judgment. Perhaps a good prayer to help lead us to forgiveness is: Lord, you are the just judge – you take care of it. Forgiveness is not forgetting. Forgetting takes much longer because our unconscious mind tends to hold on to the hurt. If we forgive, then forgetting will eventually occur. If we don't forgive, we will never forget and the memories and hurt will grow and fester and our need for revenge will increase.

The other aspect of mercy is compassion for those in need. The needy is a very broad category. It not only includes the poor, sick, physically deprived but also those who are interiorly poor, sinners and spiritually deprived. Jesus asks us to be aware of those who are in need both physically and spiritually and help them as best we can. This beatitude calls us to better forgive those who may have hurt us, to stop the cycle of violence and to reach out as best we can to those who are in need.

The sixth beatitude is: 'Blessed are the pure of heart, for they shall see God'. This reflects Jesus' emphasis on interior attitudes rather than just our external behavior of trying to look good to others. If we do not change our interior attitudes on humility, gentleness, righteousness, forgiveness and compassion, our external actions will not be humble, gentle, open to God's Will, forgiving or merciful. This beatitude calls us to an interior transformation that will enable us to imitate Jesus more closely.

The seventh beatitude is: 'Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called sons of God'. This refers back to the Hebrew shalom which means 'perfect completeness or fulfillment, a condition in which nothing is lacking'. When a Jewish person greeted another with shalom, it signified – I wish you to be perfectly fulfilled with and through God. It is also a wish for another's righteousness or readiness for salvation in God. In the New Testament, the use of the Greek word irene took on the connotation of civil peace, reconciliation and resolutions of disputes. Matthew, in his Gospel, probably uses the word with both the Hebrew and Greek ideas. For Jesus, looking at this beatitude from the Hebrew culture, a 'shalom-maker' would be a person who helps people move toward their salvation and fulfillment in God. And, as part of this, helps people to be at peace in their hearts, to remove self-centeredness, pride and narcissism. A peacemaker informs and leads others to the Kingdom of God but also brings peace in the heart. Peacemaking means bringing about reconciliation in the world by helping people to have peace in their hearts. This beatitude calls us to preach the Gospel by our lives and to help instill inner peace in both ourselves and others.

A Call for Catechists

The BEST news: We are growing every week as a Cathedral parish family!!!! This gift means that there is a large need to pass on the faith in formal ways – to all ages – children, youth and adults. Becoming saints and raising up future saints.

Are you looking for an opportunity to grow more in your faith and in holiness? Serving as a catechist is more than simply showing up to cover a need. It is more than filling an empty space with a warm body. **It is a true vocation:** a call from Christ to serve his Church! A call which allows both you and those you serve to grow in holiness.

All people – not just priests and nuns – have a vocation: a call to live a life of holiness following after Christ. In addition, some people have a particular vocation or calling to serve the Church in very important ways. Being a catechist is one of them.

Within our community, it takes many dedicated individuals to pass on the faith to others through Preschool Catechesis, Elementary School Kids Clubs, Middle School and High School Youth Group, and Adult Faith Formation and Bible Studies. Most programs run Aug-May during the school year.

John Paul II in his 1990 encyclical letter, *Redemptoris Missio* (Mission of the Redeemer), describes catechists as, ***“specialized workers, direct witnesses, indispensable evangelizers, who represent the basic strength of Christian communities, especially in the young Churches” (no. 73).***

Further, we find the following definition for the role of catechists in the assembly documents from the Congregation for the Evangelization of Peoples (CEP), ***“The catechist is a lay person specially appointed by the Church, in accordance with local needs, to make Christ known, loved and followed by those who do not yet know Him and by the faithful themselves.”***

Would you prayerfully consider if God may be calling you to this particular unique vocation to serve our Cathedral parish as a catechist?
